Those worshiping at home may wish to create a sacred space by lighting a candle.

For those worshipping with us today in person:

Thank you for being with us today to share in worship.

It is important to us that we gather as safely as possible and that we follow all of the government and diocesan guidelines. This means that we must do the following whenever we meet together in the church:

- Enter through the main door
- Answer the screening questions the greeter will ask you as you enter
- Sign in at the contact tracing table
- Wear a mask at all times while inside the church building, being sure to cover both your mouth and your nose (disposable masks are available at the door)
- Use hand sanitizer as you enter
- Sit one household to a pew
- Maintain a 2 metre (6 foot) distance between yourself and others (not including members of your own household or 'bubble')
- Congregational singing is now allowed. Please follow all other safety measures, including wearing a mask and maintaining a 2m distance from those outside your household while singing.
- Follow the instructions for passing the Peace and receiving Communion

Please note that if you are experiencing any unexplained recent symptoms such as cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose, sneezing, or sore throat, if you have travelled outside the country in the last 14 days, or if you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, you will be asked not to enter the building. Contact your health care provider or telehealth (1-866-797-0000) for further instruction.

If you have been asked to stay home, you can still join us for online worship. Visit www.sjwt.ca for the link and instructions.

Thank you for taking these measures with us so that we can safely reopen for in-person worship. Your attention to the wellbeing of others is an important way of loving your neighbours as yourself.

PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD FIRST READING

A reading from the Hebrew Testament book of the prophet Jeremiah.

The days are surely coming, says God, when I will fulfill the promise

I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.

In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: "God is our righteousness."

THE PSALM

The Psalm is printed in the bulletin. We will read alternatively.

Certainly, none of the people who rely on You will be shamed, but those who are unfaithful, who intentionally deceive, they are the ones who will be disgraced.

Feed me Your word because You are the True God who has saved me. I wait all day long, hoping, trusting in You.

Gracious Eternal One, remember Your compassion; rekindle Your concern and love, which have always been part of Your actions toward those who are Yours.

Do not Hold against me the sins I committed when I was young; instead, deal with me according to Your mercy and love.

Then Your goodness may be demonstrated in all the world, Eternal One.

Immensely good and honorable is the Eternal; that is why God teaches sinners the way.

With Justice, God directs the humble in all that is right, and shows them the way.

Reader: Glory to God, Source of all being, Eternal Word and Holy Spirit

All: As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; we

give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, who in the fullness of time came among us in our flesh, and opened to us the way of salvation. Now we watch for the day when he will come again in power and great triumph to judge this world, that we, without shame or fear, may rejoice to behold his appearing. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

cannot now receive you sacramentally, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself to you, and embrace you with all the affections of my soul. Let me never be

separated from you. Let me live and die in your love. Amen

Come, Jesus, dwell in me in the fullness of your strength, in the perfection of your ways, and in the holiness of your Spirit, and rule over every hostile power in the might of your

Spirit, and to the glory of God. Amen.

May the Body and Blood of our Saviour Jesus Christ preserve my body and soul unto everlasting life. Amen.

Communion will be administered in front of the altar. When it is your turn, please step forward to the indicated place. The priest will say "The Body of Christ ..." or similar words while you remain there. You may then approach to receive the Consecrated Bread in your hands.

To consume the Bread, walk to one of the stations facing the bottles of hand sanitizer. Remove your mask, consume the host, replace your mask, sanitize your hands, and return to your seat using the side aisle.

Only Consecrated Bread will be distributed at this time, but please be assured that those who receive Communion in one kind have received the Sacrament in its fullness.

Anyone who is a baptized Christian, from any denomination, is welcome to receive Communion.

Those who do not wish to receive Communion at this time are welcome to come forward for a blessing. Please cross your arms over your chest to indicate that you wish to be blessed.
